Sub: Grant of yearly permission to Iqra Unani Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, G. No. 25/2, Iqra Nagar, Mohdi Shivar, Shirsoli Roa, Post Box, Jalgaon-425135, Maharashtra (Inst. ID: UNI0299) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Iqra Unani Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, G. No. 25/2, Iqra Nagar, Mohdi Shivar, Shirsoli Roa, Post Box, Jalgaon-425135, Maharashtra (Inst. ID: UNI0299)** inspection was conducted on **22.05.2025 and 23.05.2025**, as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Unani colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2023 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects were observed:-**

A. Teaching staffs:-

- Arabic teacher is not available.
- Shortcoming of communication skill teacher.
- Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BUMS). Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is**

B. Teaching Pharmacy:-

- Quality testing lab is not available as per Visitor's Observation.

C. Biometric attendance

- However, on verification with the AEBAS team, it came to notice that 12 faculties has been registered on AEBAS as login credential was granted on 03.03.2025. But none of the registered faculty is fulfilling the minimum AEBAS requirement.

D. Functionality of the hospital:-

- No. of OPD 08 available and no OPD is available in Ilmul Samoom(Clinical Toxicology)

E. Visitor's observations:-

- There is no separate OPD for screening and counseling.
- There are only one Procedure room name as minor OT for all OPD procedures.
- No Screening OPD, No Ilmul Samoom OPD, No Isbat (causality) and no procedure room available in Amraz-Uzn anaf, wa halaque, Amraz-e-Jild wa taziniyat, Qabalt wa Amraz e Niswan.
- AEBAS is installed but not working.

- 3) Accordingly, the assessment report has been carefully examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report was placed in **130th Board Meeting of MARB-ISM held on 01.07.2025** and the Board decided to seek clarification from the college with regard to afore mentioned shortcoming/defects and the same was informed to you vide letter of even no. dated 23.07.2025. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide letter ref. No. I.U.M.C.H/157/2025 dated 28.07.2025 received through E-mail dated 29.07.2025.
- 4) Further, in view of the clarification submitted by you, the assessment report along with clarification was placed in the **140th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 12.08.2025**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, **the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to college for the remaining shortcoming.**
- 5) Accordingly, an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 23.08.2025** was provided to you to appear on **26.08.2025** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission to your college for the academic session 2025-26 be denied.**
- 6) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter. ref. no. I.U.M.C.H/175/2025 dated 25.08.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Mohammad Abdul Quddus, Principal & Dr. Shoeb Shaikh, Vice Principal of the college** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **26.08.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

1.	On verification with the AEBAS team, it came to notice that 33 faculties have been registered on AEBAS as login credential was granted on 03.03.2025 and 10 out of 33 registered faculties (from 23.07.2025 to till date as prior to 23.07.2025 the college was not marking attendance due to technical error) are not fulfilling the minimum AEBAS requirement and delay implementation of AEBAS.	<p>The College Principal submitted their clarification vide letter ref. no. I.U.M.C.H/175/2025 dated 25.08.2025 with stated that :</p> <p>With reference to subject mentioned above our College facing technical error in AEBAS from the 03/03/2025, we have not been able to successfully perform AEBAS due to a technical error in the device. The visitor of NCISM 2025-26 also considered this as a valid reason.</p> <p>It is inform you that, our college was facing technical issues in establishing AEBAS and same was informed to the MARBISM on whatsapp group and by mail also. but not reply from NCISM. For this issue we also many times contact via mail and through call the AEBAS vendor, but the vendor belong to the Sangli district and the distance of Sangli from our college is 700 Km due to long distance AEBAS Vendor is not physically support as eraly. Vendor is physicaly visit our college on 15/07/2025 and solved our issue.</p> <p>However, the issue got resolved on 17/07/2025 and we immediately registered our faculties and since than our faculties are marking attendance on daily basis. We are sent the information about the resolve our problem.</p> <p>Therefore we request you to kindly consider our request and grant the permission for Academic year 2025-26 and hereby we are also attaching the affidavit for AEBAS and we assure you that we will maintain the AEBAS system and we will not let this precious project of AEBAS implementation go in vain and all related documents are</p>	<p>Hearing attended by: Dr. Mohammad Abdul Quddus, Principal & Dr. Shoeb Shaikh, Vice Principal</p> <p>Submission of the college with respect to the technical errors in Biometric machine accepted in lieu of their correspondence made with the vendor. The same were also sent to NCISM.</p> <p>Therefore submission may be considered.</p> <p>As per the submission of the college Biometric machine is functioning properly since 16.07.2025. Biometric attendance record from 11.07.2025 to 25.08.2025 is verified from the AEBAS portal. As per the record, 29 out of 33 faculties are regularly marking their attendance and have more than 65% attendance in AEBAS. Hence these 29 faculties are considered.</p> <p>Therefore submission may be considered</p> <p>Remaining 4 faculties were registered in AEBAS on 08.07.2025. As per the submission of the college, 3 out of these 4 faculties (Dr. Taqdees Fatema, Dr. Mairaj Iqbal and Dr. Shaziya Parveen) were not able to mark their attendance in AEBAS due to non-updation of their Aadhaar. Their Aadhaar were updated in August 2025 and thereafter these faculties are marking their attendance regularly. Dr. Khadija Ansari is not marking attendance in AEBAS as she is on leave and out of country.</p> <p>Therefore submission may not be considered</p>

- 7) Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Unani colleges and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was duly placed before the **143th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 26.08.2025 and Board decided that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria for issuance of Yearly Permission in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 23.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue the yearly permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

"DECISION"

- 8) **Therefore, Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Iqra Unani Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, G. No. 25/2, Iqra Nagar, Mohdi Shivar, Shirsoli Roa, Post Box, Jalgaon-425135, Maharashtra (Inst. ID: UNI0299) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course in accordance with Regulation 16 (2) & 16 (3)(h) of MESAR UG (Unani) 2023, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 and subject to the condition that the following requirements shall be fulfilled: -**
- I. **Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BUMS) course shall be treated as all India quota.** The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 9) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 10) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 11) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 12) **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 16(3)(b) of MESAR UG Unani, 2023 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the process of issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Unani colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2023.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for the Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Unani Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) **The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 2, shall be fulfilled.**

- 13) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
- 14) **Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.**
